**13.0** The Chairman extended a hearty welcome to the members of Academic Council (AC) of Godavari Institute of Engineering & Technology (Autonomous), Rajahmundry to its Thirteenth Academic Council Meeting.

**13.1** The AC re-confirmed minutes of the Twelfth Meeting of Academic Council of GIET(A) which was held on 10<sup>th</sup> November, 2021 is attached vide Annexure 13.1.

#### **13.2 Academic Affairs**

##### **13.2.1 AICTE's Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS)**

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- AC noted that the institute was accorded permission under AICTE's Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS) from A.Y. 2021-'22 to promote national integration by offering the students of Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh admission to UG programmes.
- One candidate (Ms. Kiran Malhotra - 21551A0536) got admitted (Ref. No. 2021284461) in A.Y. 2021-'22 under PMSSS from Jammu in CSE department.

### 13.2.2 Approval of Minutes of College Academic Committee (CAC) Meetings

The minutes of CAC meetings were noted and approved by the Academic Council and are attached vide Annexure 13.2.2.

### 13.2.3 AICTE – LITE Programme

Members of AC have noted that GIET (A) was selected for AICTE-LITE program and had MoU which was already noted and approved by the previous AC too.

The following points were put up before AC for deliberation in this regard.

1. According to the GRBT 20 regulations approved earlier, we can offer the minor degree in web development only to the non-CSE branches. Is it possible to offer the Advanced Web Development course to CSE as an honors course?

AC noted the Reply from AICTE-LITE as mentioned hereunder.

“Regarding your question on offering Advanced Web Development as *Honors* to CSE students: Our answer is **Yes**.

As per the AICTE LITE Programme, the courses are designed to be integrated as a 20 credit minor degree as outlined in the LITE curriculum handbook. The Minor Degree in Advanced Web Development is a compilation of four courses that is designed in a way that enables students to enrich every skill that they require to remain “industry-ready”.

Since the credit requirement to get a Major degree with Honors is also 20 credits, CSE students from your institution can opt for Honors instead of Minor Degree since they are not eligible for the latter as per university regulations. Please do ensure that you inform the University and secure the necessary approvals from the Academic Council and other statutory bodies.”

After deliberations the AC approved to offer ‘Advanced Web Development’ course of AICTE LITE programme as Honors course for CSE and allied branches students.

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2. We have allotted 4 credits maximum for a course but in the LITE courses the credits for WD 201 and WD 301 each is 6. How to incorporate this in our curriculum?

AC noted the Reply from AICTE-LITE as mentioned hereunder.

“There is a requirement of minimum 20 credits for getting a Minor Degree and that is met through the set of 4 courses - WD101, WD201, WD301 and WD401. The Minor Degree course curriculum and credits have been approved by the NEAT programme. The curriculum has been shared with AICTE for approval as a Model Curriculum for Minor Degree in Advanced Web Development. AICTE has also issued a letter to your Parent university to approve the curriculum and support the minor degree integration for your students. These are the standard steps that are usually followed in getting approval for introducing a new minor degree and we have done everything from our end so far. With all this, the respective college/Institute should be able to get the approval by the governing authorities for the Minor Degree with the credits specified. After deliberations, AC opined that as the course was already approved by AICTE LITE, the course can be offered with the designed credits upon due approval by the BoS, and necessary amendment shall be made in the already approved regulations.

However, after declaration of the above result, if any student becomes ineligible, he/she shall be dropped from the Honors/Minor programme.

#### 13.7.3 Internships after 2-2 and 3-2 evaluated in 3-1 and 4-1 for B.Tech programs: Can we consider - Industrial Training/Mini project/ MOOCs certificate courses ( due to no Summer break)?

AC approved to consider Industrial Training/Mini project/ MOOCs certificate courses with credits validation as the cause is very much genuine.
