ACADEMIC REGULATIONS – MCA (R-14)

RMC 1.0	ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSIONS
	Admission to the above programme shall be made subject to the Eligibility, qualifications and specialization prescribed by the University from time to time. Admissions shall be made on the basis of merit rank obtained by the candidate at ICET examination subject to reservations prescribed by the AP government from time to time.

RMC 2.0	AWARD OF MCA DEGREE
2.1	A student shall be declared eligible for the award of MCA degree, if he pursues a course of study and completes it successfully for not less than three academic years and not more than six academic years.
2.2	A Student, who fails to fulfill all the academic requirements for the award of the degree within six academic years from the year of their admission, shall forfeit his seat in MCA course.
2.3	The MCA Degree of the Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University Kakinada shall be conferred on candidates who are admitted to the program and fulfill all the requirements for the award of the Degree and obtain 136 prescribed credits.
2.4	The minimum instruction for each semester shall be 90 clear instruction days.

RMC 3.0	ATTENDANCE
3.1	A candidate shall be deemed to have eligibility to write End Semester Examinations if he has put in a minimum of 75% of attendance in aggregate of all the subjects. Condonation of shortage of attendance up to 10% i.e. 65% and above, and below 75% may be given by the College academic committee. Condonation of shortage of attendance shall be granted only on genuine and valid reasons on representations by the candidate with supporting evidence.
3.2	Shortage of attendance below 65 % shall in NO case be condoned.
3.3	A candidate shall not be promoted to the next semester unless he fulfills the attendance requirements of the previous semester. A stipulated fee shall be payable towards condonation of shortage of attendance

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RMC 4.0	EVALUATION
4.1	The performance of the candidate in each semester shall be evaluated subject-wise, with a maximum of 100 marks, & 4 credits for theory and 100 marks & 2 credits for Laboratory , on the basis of Internal Evaluation and End Semester Examination.
4.2	<p>Theory subjects evaluation</p> <p>a <u>Semester End Examination</u> For the theory subjects 60 marks shall be awarded based on the performance in the External Examination with external paper setting & evaluation. Question paper for this examination shall be prepared externally by paper setters from the panel of paper setters recommended by the Chairperson of the Boards of Studies. The evaluation of the answer scripts shall be done externally by evaluators belonging to University colleges, Autonomous colleges or by evaluators recommended by the Chairpersons of BOS.</p> <p>b <u>Internal assessment</u> 40 marks shall be awarded based on the Internal Evaluation. Internal Evaluation shall be made based on the average of the marks secured in the two Mid Term- Examinations conducted, one in the middle of the Semester and the other immediately after the completion of instruction. Each mid term examination shall be conducted for duration of 120 minutes with 4 questions to be answered out of 4 questions.</p>
4.3	<p><u>Practical Subjects evaluation</u> For practical subjects Maximum marks allocated are 100. Of this 50 marks shall be awarded based on the performance in the End Semester Examination & 50 Marks are for internal assessment.</p> <p>a <u>Semester end Practical examination</u> Semester end practical examination is to be conducted by two examiners. Of these two examiners one will be an external examiner from another college nominated from the panel of examiners recommended by the chairperson of the BOS. The other examiner shall be normally the laboratory class teacher or another faculty of the department nominated by the Head of the department.</p> <p>b <u>Internal assessment of practical(s)</u> Out of the total 100 marks for the practical subjects, 50 marks of shall be awarded by internal assessment. Of these 50 marks, 25 marks shall be awarded based on the day-to-day performance in the laboratory. The remaining 25 Marks shall be awarded by an internal practical examination at the end of the semester. There shall be two internal examiners for this. One of the internal examiners shall be the concerned faculty and the other will be a faculty of the department nominated by the HOD.</p>
4.4	There shall be a mini project (50 marks & 2 credits) in IV semester consisting of documentation & the presentation for which the evaluation shall be internal.
4.5	There shall be a seminar presentation (50 marks & 2 credits) during VI semester. For seminar, a student under the supervision of a faculty member, shall collect the literature on a topic and critically review the literature and submit it to the Department in a report form and shall make an oral presentation before the Department Committee. The Department Committee consists of Head of the Department, supervisor and two other senior faculty members of the department. For seminar there will be only internal evaluation of 50 marks. A candidate has to secure a minimum of 50% to be declared successful.

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<p>4.6</p> <p>4.7</p> <p>4.8</p>	<p>A candidate shall be deemed to have secured the minimum academic requirement in a subject if he secures a minimum of 40% of marks in the End Examination and a minimum aggregate of 50% of the total marks in the End Semester Examination and Internal Evaluation taken together.</p> <p>In case the candidate does not secure the minimum academic requirement in any subject (as specified in 4.6) he has to reappear for the End Examination in that subject. A candidate shall be given one chance to re-register for each subject provided the internal marks secured by a candidate are less than 50% and he has failed in the end examination. In such case candidate must re-register for subjects(s) and secure required minimum attendance. Attendance in the re-registered subjects(s) shall be calculated separately to decide upon the eligibility for writing the end examination in those subjects (s). In the event of taking another chance, the internal marks and end examination marks obtained in the previous attempt are nullified. At a given time a candidate is permitted to re-register for maximum of two subjects in addition to the subjects of regular semester.</p> <p>A candidate shall be allowed to submit the project report (150 Marks & 10 credits) only after fulfilling the attendance and pass requirements of all the semesters. The viva-voce examination shall be conducted at the end of the course work (6th semester).</p>

<p>5.1</p> <p>5.2</p> <p>5.3</p> <p>5.4</p> <p>5.5</p> <p>5.6</p> <p>5.7</p> <p>5.8</p> <p>5.9</p>	<p>Every candidate shall be required to submit thesis or dissertation after taking up a topic approved by the Project Review Committee.</p> <p>A Project Review Committee (PRC) shall be constituted with Principal/Director as chair person, Head of the Department and two other senior faculty members of the concerned department (one will be the guide) .</p> <p>Registration of Project Work: A candidate is permitted to register for the project work after satisfying the attendance requirement of all the subjects (theory and practical subjects) up to V semester.</p> <p>After satisfying 5.2, a candidate has to submit, in consultation with his project supervisor, the title, objective and plan of action of his project work(Based on a publication in a peer Reviewed Journal) to the Project Review Committee for its approval before the fifth semester end examinations. After obtaining the approval of the Committee the student can initiate the Project work after the fifth semester end examinations.</p> <p>Every candidate shall work on projects approved by the PRC of the College.</p> <p>The duration of the project is for one semester.</p> <p>If a candidate wishes to change his supervisor or topic of the project he can do so with approval of the PRC. However, the Project Review Committee (PRC) shall examine whether the change of topic/supervisor leads to a major change of his initial plans of project proposal. If so, his date of registration for the project work starts from the date of change of Supervisor or topic as the case may be.</p> <p>A candidate shall submit status report in two stages at least with a gap of 1 month between them.</p> <p>The work on the project shall be initiated in the beginning of the Sixth semester and the duration of the project is for one semester. A candidate shall be allowed to submit the project report only with the approval of PRC and not earlier than 20 weeks from the date of registration of the project work. For the approval of PRC the candidate shall submit the draft copy of thesis to the Principal (through Head of the Department) and shall make an oral presentation before the PRC.</p> <p>Three copies of the Project Thesis certified by the supervisor shall be submitted to the college</p>

	<p>The thesis shall be adjudicated by one examiner selected by the Principal. For this, the chairman BOS of the College shall submit a panel of 5 examiners, who are eminent in that field with the help of the concerned guide.</p>																																				
5.10	<p>If the report of the examiner is favorable, viva-voce examination shall be conducted by a board consisting of the supervisor, Head of the Department and the examiner who adjudicated the Thesis. The Board shall jointly report candidates work as:</p>

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		debarred and forfeits the seat. Person(s) who do not belong to the College will be handed over to police and, a police case will be registered against them.
MPR 10.	Comes in a drunken condition to the examination hall.	Expulsion from the examination hall and cancellation of the performance in that subject and all other subjects the candidate has already appeared including practical examinations and project work and shall not be permitted for the remaining examinations of the subjects of that semester/year.
MPR 11.	Copying detected on the basis of internal evidence, such as, during valuation or during special scrutiny.	Cancellation of the performance in that subject and all other subjects the candidate has appeared including practical examinations and project work of that semester/year examinations.
MPR 12.	If any malpractice is detected which is not covered in the above clauses 1 to 11 shall be reported to the Academic council for further action to award suitable punishment.	

ANNEXURE II

**TRANSITORY REGULATIONS FOR UG/PG STUDENTS SEEKING
RE-ADMISSION INTO 2014 REGULATIONS**

(Detained due to shortage of attendance / lack of credits in earlier Regulations)

1. The student has to continue the course work along with the regular students of the respective semester in which the student gets re-admission. Prior approval from JNTUK should be obtained before re-admission of a candidate through Transitory Regulations.
2. Substitute / compulsory subjects shall be offered in place of subjects that are already studied earlier. The student has to register for those specific subjects. The Chairman BOS and Chairman Academic Council are to consult JNTUK and obtain authorization to offer alternative subjects in new regulation.
3. The mode of internal evaluation (i.e., in-course assessments) and external evaluation (i.e., end-semester examinations) shall be on par with the regular students, i.e., the student has to follow the new mode of internal evaluation and the new question paper

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model for the end-semester examinations along with the regular students of the respective semester in which the student gets re-admission. However, the affiliating university's approval is to be obtained before such re-admission on case to case basis.

4. For the subjects studied under earlier regulations but failed, the student has to appear, pass and acquire credits from the supplementary examinations with-in the time provided by the affiliating university.
5. The promotion criteria based on attendance as well as credits shall be in accordance with the regulations under which the student is re- admitted into the New Regulation specific to the New Subjects/ Substitute subjects in the new regulation as approved by JNTUK.
6. Credits already awarded and approved as per new regulation will be pro-rated in terms of new-credit system. To be eligible for the award of the degree, the student shall complete the attendance requirements and appear for the end semester examination in all the courses as per new regulation, including the substitute/compulsory courses as prescribed in the transitory course structure and shall acquire at least the minimum of stipulated credits. If a student in such exercise crosses the said minimum no of credits, the lowest marks/grades scored will be excluded for calculating final grade. The affiliating university's decision is final in this regard.
7. All other academic requirements shall be in accordance with the regulations under which the student was re-admitted.
8. The decision of the affiliating university is final and is binding on the transitory students on any clarification/ query/doubt and whatsoever, the decision of the Affiliating University - JNTUK is final.
